## Key knowledge

The Maya were the first Mesoamerican civilization to develop writing, using hieroglyphs. X

The Maya were more advanced that Britain at the time:

They also developed a complex number system using peddles, sticks and shells.

The Maya observed the movement of the sun, moon and stars to create calendars

Without the use of metal tools, wheels or domesticated animals they were able to build specular temples and pyramids

The Maya civilization consisted of a large number of city-states.

Each city-state had its own independent government. A city-state was made up of a major city and the surrounding areas which sometimes included some smaller settlements and cities.

Each city state was ruled by a king who the Maya believed that their king was given the right to rule by the gods.

There were also powerful councils of leaders who ran the government, chosen from the class of nobles. Because religion was an important part of the Maya life, the priests were powerful figures in the government as well.

1100 BC - The first Mayan settlements began to appear in Mesoamerica along the pacific coast

800 BC -Instead of foraging, maize farming began and trade between villages began

700 BC Mayan writing began to develop through the form of hieroglyphs

100 BC - 450 AD Mayans constructed their first pyramids develop cities including Tikal

638 AD Pakal the Great (King of Palenque) died. His death mask was made of jade.

800 - 900 AD Mayan civilization declined
