The Romans left Britain in around 400AD. After the Romans left the Anglo-Saxons invaded from the South and the Scots from the North. The Vikings also came to Britain. After a long time and many battles, both Vikings and Anglo-Saxons lived in Britain at the same time (until 954 AD, The end of Danelaw).

793 AD Vikings attacked the monastery of Lindisfarne

Viking men spent most of their time farming
Vikings placed their dead (with their possessions) in ships, which
were either buried or set on fire and sent to Valhalla.

Many place names come from the Vikings eg thorp, thwaite

871 AD - 899 AD rule of Alfred the Great











