Key knowledge

The Ancient Egyptians were an advanced civilization in northern Africa who lived at the same time as the Bronze Age societies in Britain.

Society was hierarchical and your place in society was defined by your role e.g. farmers and slaves, craftsmen, scribes and soldiers, nobles and priest, vizier, pharaoh

Ancient Egyptians believed in the 'afterlife'. Bodies were mummified to preserve them but it was expensive, so only happened to rich people. Most people were poor and buried in pits in the desert. Pyramids were built as burial tombs for the most important people in society @

Ancient Egypt was ruled by pharaoh. Tutankhamun became pharaoh at the age of 8 or 9.

Ancient Egyptians stopped hunting and gathering and began farming the land on the Nile which flooded annually and provided fertile soil. Poor people were the workers (slaves).

Many poor slaves and farm workers did the difficult lifting and building
